

2017 Float Rider's Corner—Lindsey Beckmeyer



When I was in the process of developing and drafting a concept design for the float I was not optimistic about my chances of winning. My art teacher who suggested it to me could not give me any details about any other contestants, but I assumed that my submission would only be one of many, and so not likely to be chosen. Honestly, I thought of it a lot like buying a raffle ticket: I know my chances of winning weren't abysmal, but I never actually expected it to be me.

Anyway, I had fun creating a design. It's not every day that one's teacher lets you do literally whatever you want. My original design was of a dragon attacking a castle tower while a bunch of people ran screaming, and, of course, the lone knight was facing off against with sword and shield. It was fun and kind of silly, to be honest, but maybe that's what judges were looking for, because that's what they chose after all.

It didn't actually hit home that I had won the design contest until I was standing at the front of the council chambers next to Mayor Furey holding the finalized version of my design. The whole experience was unbelievably surreal.

My experience riding on my float down Colorado Boulevard was as exciting and joyous as it was nerve wracking and torturous. The other riders were incredibly nice and so hanging out with them was a lot of fun. Their presence made the whole ordeal much more enjoyable than I think it would have been otherwise. I tend to get really nervous and overwhelmed when I'm the center of attention, and there were literally thousands of people watching me at any given time during the parade.

It was great to see people oohing and aahing over my float design. It gave me great pride to know that people liked my concept. The highlight of the event for me was definitely seeing my friends and family along the parade route. It was tiring to wave even a light plastic sword around for that many hours, but their excitement and encouragement gave me the strength to keep going. Overall, I really enjoyed riding in the parade.


